Where to find the list of available lectures?

- On the Basis-Webside (https://basis.uni-bonn.de/qisserver/rds?state=user&type=0&topitem=&breadCrumbSource=&topitem=functions) make sure that you selected the right semester in the upper right corner
- click on Vorlesungsverzeichnis and select Alle Veranstaltungen
- then look for Politische Wissenschaft und Soziologie
- choose which study program/level (Bachelor of Political Science and Civics, Master Political science, or Master Sociology) is closest to your program at your home university
- technically you can attend classes from all programs and levels

How to enroll in classes?

- Erasmus-students cannot officially register via Basis, you use it just to find the courses you like to attend
- Contact the teachers of the courses you want to participate in and ask them, if you can join the course
- if they give you their go that is all you need

What course gives how many credits?

- Just a proof of your attendance in the class brings you 4 ECTS
- all other options are listed below:

Is attendance mandatory?

- All courses within the IPWS do not have a mandatory attendance
- Language courses usually take attendance

How to extend the stay in Bonn?

- Write an informal application to both the Erasmus-coordinator in Bonn and at your home university
- If they sign it, you can stay in Bonn for another semester
- Turn that in as soon as possible, not towards the end of your stay

What to do at the end of the semester?

- If not already done, talk with the teacher of the course about the type of final exam you need/want to take
- Fill out the "Preparing your Transcript" (will be sent to you towards the end
 of the semester) and send it to your Erasmus-coordinator in Bonn

- Send all your teacher the Vorlageschein (will be sent to you towards the end of the semester)

- as soon as you get these documents back, send them as well to your
 Erasmus-coordinator in Bonn (<u>incomings-ipws-erasmus@uni-bonn.de</u>)
- you will then get your final Transcript of Records from us
- if you are staying in Bonn for two semesters, please do this at the end of both semesters
